In response to input from our congregation, and a recommendation from the Worship Committee, our Session voted to begin a **new worship schedule on Sunday, Sept. 11**. We will provide four distinct worship services: Chapel at 8:15 a.m., Contemporary at 9:30 a.m., and Traditional at 11:00 a.m. The Mandarin/Taiwanese worship service moves to 11:00 a.m. *Authentic and inspired worship in a clear variety of styles will offer more options for our congregation and our guests.*

FPCB provides a number of Music Groups for a variety of experiences:


Women Together

JAM is the middle school ministry at FPCB. We create programs as vehicles to share God's saving love with every 6th—8th grader we encounter.

JAM Wednesday: A weekly program filled with energetic games, interactive activities, and thoughtful discussions all woven together by God's story. We make JAM Wednesday the highlight of every middle school student's week. (Wednesdays, 9/7—12/14)

JAM Fun n' Friends night: a once-a-month fun event that creates an exciting venue for middle school students to connect with old friends and newcomers.

JAM Sunday: Students participate in intergenerational worship and are then dismissed for a quirky, interactive look into the biblical story. Every 1st Sunday all students remain in the worship service for its entirety in order to participate in communion.

Mt Hermon: JAM's fall retreat combines the adventure and beauty of the Santa Cruz Mountains with dynamic, creative teaching sessions lead by a veteran youth ministry speaker. Youth can sign up individually or come as part of the all-church retreat with their family. (October 14—16)

ROCK is the First Pres group for High School students. We spend time playing games, listening to speakers, and discussing our faith.

ROCK Thursdays: This year ROCK will return to Thursday evenings from 7:00–8:30PM. This Fall we will focus on faith beyond the walls of the church. Students can expect to participate in service projects, hear from a wide variety of adult volunteers living out their faith, and discuss God's word in small groups. We will do all of this in typical ROCK style—while having fun, singing songs, and being crazy together. (Thursdays 7:00–8:30 p.m., 8/8—12/15)

ROCK Sunday: Young teens participate in intergenerational worship and are then dismissed to the Game Room, where they will be led in a discussion on the Bible. Every 1st Sunday all teens remain in the worship service for its entirety in order to participate in communion.

Mt Hermon: ROCK's fall retreat at Mount Hermon is held in conjunction with our all-church retreat. This year high school students will break into small groups discussion with students from Calvary Presbyterian to hear from a speaker, play games, take on adventure courses, and grow in community.
